



**TOWN MANAGER-** We would like to thank all citizens who turned out for our annual town meeting and making it a successful event. In our elections of June 13<sup>th</sup>, Selectmen Dana B. Rice was reelected to another three year term without opposition. Bonnie Kane and Deborah Bisson were elected to our planning board and three budget committee members have also been appointed including Mary Ann Higgins, Jay Bricker and Deborah Bisson. Our Queen Victoria Bell was returned to the town office on June 13<sup>th</sup> from the Canadian Museum for Human Rights after a six month stay. All proceeds of the bell's rental fee will be donated to the Gouldsboro Historical Society. The bell is back in its case in the lobby of the town office for all those wishing to visit. A reminder that the town office will be closed on July 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> for the holiday, however shellfish licenses will still be available from 8am-12noon on July 3.
