SELECTMEN/TOWN MANAGER- Please join us at the Annual Town Meeting at the Peninsula School in Prospect Harbor Wednesday, June 13th at 7PM. I'd like to thank the Budget Committee for their review of the 2018/19 proposed budget. I know it hasn't been an easy process these last few months. All of your hard work is truly appreciated. The Gouldsboro Town Park is starting to take shape with the installation of rose bushes, perennials and stone. Looks like a great place for a bag lunch on a sunny day! Please have patience with traffic delays in Prospect Harbor while the MDOT Sidewalk project continues. With the added blasting that was needed the contractor has been given an additional four weeks to complete the project, extending the finish date to July 20th.

TOWN CLERK- State, Town and School District Voting will take place on Tuesday, June 12th from 8AM - 8PM at the Gouldsboro Community Center located on the Pond Road. Town Meeting will take place on Wednesday, June 13th at 7PM at the Peninsula School in Prospect Harbor.

Deadline to Request Absentee Ballot: For the June 12, 2018 Election, the deadline for a voter to request an absentee ballot, **including a ballot voted in the presence of the clerk**, is Thursday, June 7, 2018, unless the voter completes a ***Special Circumstances Application***.

RSU 24 SCHOOL BOARD- It's hard to believe that the end of the school year is quickly approaching. Class night at Sumner Memorial High School is on June 5th and graduation is June 7th. The end of the school year for all students is Friday, June 15th. Summer will be here before you know it! The new school building project continues to move forward. We had our straw vote on May 1st and those in attendance voted to move forward with the current Sumner location for the new building site. We will eventually seek approval from the state for this proposed site. We are also in the middle of our space allocation work. This is a collaborative project where we work with our architect and the Maine Department of Education to discuss and come with an agreement on the number of learning spaces (classrooms) and the other necessary spaces (gym, cafeteria, performance space) needed in the school. There are no design plans being discussed at this point, just number of spaces and sizes of the various spaces. This will lead to the design work, which should be developed in the fall. In addition, we do have several subcommittees meeting to discuss various facets of the building project. Please check the RSU website (rsu24.org) for the most up-to-date information on the building project or any other RSU information. A reminder that the June referendum date for the school budget is on Tuesday, June 12th. Voting takes place at your local voting stations.
