

SELECTMEN AND TOWN MANAGER: We would like to officially welcome our two new members of the Board of Selectmen, Glenn Grant and Ernie West, who officially took their seats after our annual Town Meeting. With the recent unfortunate and untimely passing of our code enforcement officer, Roger Dean and Jerry Kron have both stepped in to help us through the transition on an interim basis until a long term replacement can be found. We are very appreciative and thankful for their willingness to serve and keep the CEO's office up and running.

CODE ENFORCEMENT: Two town residents have stepped up to take over Code Enforcement duties since Ed Brackett's passing: Roger Dean is our new Interim CEO and is being helped by Jerry Kron. Roger is handling the land-based aspects of what Ed was doing and, through the rest of the summer and into autumn; Jerry is working FEMA and Floodplain issues. Jerry has been working the Floodplain challenge over the last two years. After October, Roger will be the contact for all CEO activities. Even with Jerry's help, all permit applications are to go through Roger. Roger is usually in the Town Office on Tuesday and Thursday mornings from 8:00 to about 11:00 or so. If you need to speak to him, we suggest you call to make certain Roger will be in the office; he can be out at a site inspection or away for other reasons.

SHELLFISH – GOULDSBORO CONSERVATION AREAS: July 1st is here so if you hold a Senior Resident Shellfish License and you intend to continue digging clams this year, you need to inform the Town Office and also stop by for the new ordinance booklet. The Shellfish Ordinance has been completely revised and includes several updated closures. The Shellfish Committee planted approximately 70,000 baby clams in the flats of Gouldsboro. They have closed two areas for approximately two years so it is now illegal to harvest clams in both Upper Jones Cove and Boathouse Cove. These two areas are pictured in the new ordinance booklet. This collection includes paint, fuel, engine fluids, wax, chemicals, pesticides, fluorescent bulbs, TVs and computers. **All materials must be sealed and clearly labeled, and placed in a cardboard box.**
