TRANSFER STATION HOURS & LOCATION

Transfer station permits cost \$10.00 and are valid from April 2016-April 2017 for bulk waste only. The transfer station is located at 53 Walters Road, near Route 1. Hours of operation are Fridays from 12 PM-4 PM and Sundays from 10 AM-4 PM. Recycling is collected every Wednesday (including holidays) and must be curbside no later than 7:00 AM. Trash is collected every Thursday (including holidays) and must be curbside no later than 7:00 AM. Bags must be fully tagged and not exceed 40 pounds. Please do not place recycling and trash in front of mailboxes, not to interfere with the mail carrier vehicles.
