





<u>SELECT BOARD / TOWN MANAGER</u>- Congratulations to our Charles M. Sumner High graduates and good luck on your future endeavors!

- After much debate and consideration and with very few responses about the newsletter mailing in last month's newsletter, we will be doing away with the mailing of the newsletter. We will still be creating a monthly newsletter. These will be available for pickup at the post offices, Town Office, Dorcas Library, and online on our website at www.gouldsborotown.com. **July 2024 newsletter will be the last newsletter mailed**
- Gouldsboro's Annual Town Meeting will be June 12th at 7PM at the Peninsula School.
- The Town Warrant will be posted around town, available here at the Town Office and on our website as well. Ordinances to be amended at town meeting will be the Harbor Ordinance and Land Use Ordinance. The proposed drafts are available on our website under the "ordinances" tab. All residents are encouraged to attend. However, only registered voters of Gouldsboro are able to participate in voting. The Registrar will be available for new registrations!
- Second payment of property taxes were due March 31, 2024. Thirty-day notices were sent out May 21st. Liens will be placed in June for any unpaid current year taxes. You can pay tax bills online at https://epayment.informe.org/payportonline/disclaimer/1502. Please keep in mind there is a 2.5% charge fee for debit and credit cards. This is the same fee that is charged when payments are made in person with cards as well. If you have any delinquent taxes, the payment will be applied to the oldest first.

TOWN CLERK- The new transfer station passes are now available! The cost is \$1 and punch cards are \$25. We will be offering updated Transfer Station brochures with purchase. This service is for Gouldsboro residents and taxpayers only.

ELECTIONS- The State of Maine Primary Election, RSU 24 Referendum, and Municipal Election will be held on Tuesday, June 11th, 2024. Polls will be open from 8AM – 8PM at the Gouldsboro Rec. Center, 679 Pond Road in Gouldsboro. All registered voters will be able to vote in the Municipal and RSU 24 Referendum Election, however please remember, Democratic, Republican, and Unenrolled enrollments are the ONLY parties to vote in the State of Maine Primary Election. Need to Register to vote? The Registrar will be present at the Polls on June 11th, 2024.

GOULDSBORO HISTORICAL SOCIETY- Gouldsboro Historical Society invites you to "The Abolitionists and the Underground Railroad in Maine" 7PM on Monday, June 3rd at the Women's Club in Prospect Harbor. An account of the history of slavery and emancipation in Maine will introduce the story of antislavery activism in the decades leading up to the Civil War. African Americans were prominent in advancing the cause of abolition in Maine. Myth and historical fact will be separated in revealing Mainers' involvement in the Underground Railroad. The program will be presented by Dr. Mary T. Freeman, assistant professor of history at the University of Maine, Orono. Her field is the nineteenth-century United States, with a focus on the history of slavery and abolition. Her work also explores abolitionism, African American history, and women's history in Maine and New England. She received her PhD from Columbia University in 2018. Her current book project examines letter writing in the nineteenth-century anti-slavery movement. She is also researching abolitionism and nineteenth-century African American politics in Maine.
