**SELECT BOARD / TOWN MANAGER**- Gouldsboro welcomed some new personnel in July. On the 8th, Wayne Robbins joined our police department as a full-time officer. Wayne comes to us from the Washington County Sheriff's Office. Wayne is a Washington County native and also serves in the Army National Guard. Damon Dore also joined the team on the police force on a part-time basis on July 24th. Damon is a Marine Corps veteran who also works for the Maine Air National Guard in Bangor. Also in late July, Marcia Messier started as a part-time caretaker for the Jones Pond facilities. Marcia is a Gouldsboro resident who performed similar tasks for a community in Arizona before moving to Maine. Please say hello to Marcia if you see her cleaning up around Jones Pond.

Tax bills will be sent out late August / early September. If you do not receive a bill by the end of September, please call the Town Office to request your bill. We only send out <u>ONE</u> tax bill that includes two coupons at the bottom of the bill. The first half payment is due October 31, 2024 and the second half is due March 31, 2025. You can make weekly or monthly payments as well. Please be aware, we are not required by the State of Maine to send tax bills. This will walk you through the steps and will be applied to your tax account. Please keep in mind there is a 2.5% charge fee for debit / credit cards. This is the same fee that is charged when payments are made in person or over the phone with cards.

**COASTAL RESILIENCE**- Gouldsboro has received two \$50,000 grants to work with engineers, climate experts, and the community to make its harbors more resilient in the face of big storms. The Maine Community Resilience Partnership program is contributing \$50,000 to help develop plans for the Crowley Island causeway and the junction of Corea Road and Cranberry Island Road. The Maine Coastal Community Grant/Shore and Harbor Planning Grant program has committed \$50,000 to develop resilience plans for harbors in South Gouldsboro, Bunkers Harbor, and Prospect Harbor. RSU 24- The new school building project is moving toward the finish line. The domestic water cistern project should be complete as of the end of July. The soccer field has been officially turned over to the district but requires another growing season before we can use the field. We have installed fencing around the baseball and softball fields and will do the same for the soccer field this summer. We are currently having an irrigation system installed for each of the fields to meet the watering needs. In addition, we are in the process of working with community members and businesses to design and construct the dugouts on the baseball and softball fields. The plan at this point is to begin using our baseball and softball fields in the spring of 2025 and our soccer field in the fall of 2025. We still have a number of unfilled positions for the upcoming school year. We are in the need of custodians, bus drivers, teachers, ed techs, and teachers. We are in the process of doing the regular upkeep and updating of our buildings in preparation for the 2024-2025 school year. School will start at each of our PK-5 buildings on Thursday, August 29th. We will welcome our sixth graders and ninth grades to Sumner on the 29th as well to allow those grade levels to get accustomed to their new environments. The remainder of the middle and high school will begin on Friday the 30th. Parents will receive more information from their respective schools as we get closer to the start date.
