<u>TOWN CLERK</u>- The Town Office will be closed October 2<sup>nd</sup> to allow staff to attend the Maine Municipal Association Convention for training. We will also be closed on October 14<sup>th</sup> in observance of Indigenous Peoples' Day.

- There will be a special town meeting held on October 10<sup>th</sup> starting at 5PM at the Gouldsboro Town Office regarding Land Use Ordinance LD2003 amendments. You can view the warrant and proposed changes on our town website or our Facebook page. The Select Board meeting will follow after and will hold a public hearing to adopt the Maine State updated General Assistance Maximums.
- 2025 Dog tags will be available October 15<sup>th</sup>. Per Maine State Law, all dogs 6 months and older must be licensed each year by December 31<sup>st</sup>. A \$25 late fee for each dog unregistered will start February 1<sup>st</sup>, 2025. Proof of current rabies vaccination and spay/neuter, if applicable, must be presented at the time of licensing. \$6 for neutered/spayed dogs and \$11 for unaltered dogs. You can register in person here at the Town Office or online at <a href="https://appsl.web.maine.gov/cgi-bin/online/dog\_license/index.pl">https://appsl.web.maine.gov/cgi-bin/online/dog\_license/index.pl</a>.
- The first half of property taxes are due October 31<sup>st</sup>. Be mindful, interest starts accruing November 1<sup>st</sup>. Please include a phone number with payment so we can add it to your account in case we need to get in touch with you. You are able to pay your taxes online at <a href="https://epayment.informe.org/payportonline/disclaimer/1502">https://epayment.informe.org/payportonline/disclaimer/1502</a>. If you are paying with a card over the phone, in the Town Office, or online, there is a 2.5% charge fee for anything over \$40.
- There will be a Rabies clinic held October 17, 2024 from 3PM 5:30PM at the Gouldsboro Town Office, 59 Main Street, Prospect Harbor. \$10 per dog and \$20 per cat. Dr. Brandi Smith with Go Vet Go will be administering rabies vaccines! Please be sure if you are bringing a dog, you have it on a leash, and if you are bringing a cat, it is in a cat carrier. Gouldsboro residents will also be able to register your dogs at this time!

<u>ELECTIONS</u>- The State of Maine General and Referendum Election will be held on November 5, 2024. Need to register to vote? The Registrar will be available at the polls. Polls will be open from 8AM-8PM at the Gouldsboro Rec Center, 679 Pond Road in Gouldsboro. Absentee Ballots will be available starting Monday, October 7, 2024. Closed period for new voters and party changes will begin Tuesday, October 15, 2024, at the end of business day. Gouldsboro voters can obtain an absentee ballot 3 ways: 1) Visit <a href="https://apps.web.maine.gov/cgi-bin/online/AbsenteeBallot/index.pl">https://apps.web.maine.gov/cgi-bin/online/AbsenteeBallot/index.pl</a> to request an absentee ballot via online. 2) Deliver or mail an absentee request form to the Town Office. Visit our website to print the application. 3) Call the Town Office (207) 963-5589 to request. We need to speak to each voter individually for this method.

MOORING PERMITS- <u>ALL</u> mooring fees were due by July 1<sup>st</sup> and needed to be paid by August 30<sup>th</sup> without penalty. As of September 1<sup>st</sup>, a late fee of \$25 has been added to all outstanding mooring permits. Please come into the Town Office to pay for your permits if you haven't paid.
