TOWN CLERK- The Town Office will be closed on November 11th in observance to Veterans' Day. We will also be closed November 28th & 29th in observance of Thanksgiving!

The Comprehensive Plan Committee will be meeting December 2, 2024 starting at 6PM at the Town Office. There will be a workshop held with the Comp Plan Committee and the Select Board on December 19, 2024 starting at 5PM at the Town Office to discuss the Comprehensive Plan. All are welcome to attend!

2025 Dog Tags are available, please be patient with us for the new state mandate dog licensing program. Please be sure to bring the currents rabies certificate, as this is new required for all registrations. Per Maine State Law, all dogs 6 months and older <u>MUST</u> be licensed each year by December 31st. A \$25 late fee for each dog unregistered will start February 1st, 2025. The cost is \$6 for neutered/spayed and \$11 for unaltered dogs. You can register online at https://appsl.web.maine.gov/cgibin/online/dog_license/index.pl or in person here at the office.

First half of property taxes were due October 31st. Keep in mind that interest starts accruing November 1st. Please call for an updated amount if you have not paid this yet and include a phone number with your payment so we can attach it to your account. We offer a service if you would like to pay online at https://epayment.informe.org/payportonline/disclaimer/1502. If you're sending a check, please make sure it's payable to the Town of Gouldsboro. If you pay with a credit card over the phone, in the Town Office or online, there is a 2.5% charge fee for anything over \$40. This fee goes directly to the state.

<u>ELECTIONS</u>- The State of Maine General and Referendum Election will be held on **November 5, 2024**. Need to register to vote? The Registrar will be available at the polls. Polls will be open from 8AM-8PM at the Gouldsboro Rec Center, 679 Pond Road in Gouldsboro.

MOORING PERMITS- ALL mooring fees were due by July 1st and needed to be paid by August 30th without penalty. As of September 1st, a late fee of \$25 has been added to all outstanding mooring permits. Please come into the Town Office to pay for your permits if you haven't paid.

DORCAS LIBRARY- The library will be closed Monday, November 11th for Veterans' Day and November, 28th & 30th for Thanksgiving. Children's story hour with Liz will be held Thursday, November 14th at 10:15AM. Homeschoolers are welcome! The Writers with Merry Post meet Tuesday, November 5th at 2PM.
