<u>TOWN CLERK</u>- The second half of real estate taxes were due March 31<sup>st</sup>, 2025. Interest starts accruing April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2025. If you are delinquent or going to be, please call our office to get the most accurate amount due. Residents of the community vote annually to set the date that interest will begin accruing.

Budget meetings will be held at regularly-scheduled Select Board meetings on April 10<sup>th</sup>, April 24<sup>th</sup>, with a final meeting held on May 8<sup>th</sup>.

Nomination papers are due back to the Town Office by Friday, April 11<sup>th</sup> by 1PM in order for your papers to be valid. Available seats are (2) 3-year terms for Select Board and (2) 3-year terms for Planning Board.



GOULDSBORO POLICE DEPT- Spring has sprung.... thank goodness! The dark days are over but the deer and turkeys are acting like they own the road. Please be careful during dawn and dusk so we can arrive alive!! Trucks over 23,000 pounds please adhere to posted roads March 5<sup>th</sup> through early/mid-May.

SCHOODIC FOOD PANTRY- On Friday, March 13<sup>th</sup>, we received an urgent message from Good Shepherd Food Bank notifying us of the most current federal food assistance reductions around the Federal Food and Funding freeze. These will reduce both the total pounds of food we receive and the variety of products available to us. The loss of the Local Food Purchase Assistance Cooperative Agreement Program "... represents a projected loss of 500,000 to 600,000 pounds of fresh, local produce Good Shepherd Food Bank would have distributed, through its partners, to families facing food insecurity." We are one of those partners. Additionally, we have been told to anticipate a 50% to 60% decrease in our monthly allocation of staple food products – peanut butter, canned chicken, canned vegetables, and rice, for example. We will be at Winter Harbor Provisions on Saturday, April 5<sup>th</sup>, as part of the Hancock County Food Security Network food drive for food pantries. Customers can purchase items on our recommended food list and drop them off on their way out. We will be grateful for your support.

<u>SCHOODIC COMMUNITY FUND</u>- The Schoodic Community Fund is now accepting grant applications which will be considered by our advisory committee this summer and awarded in September. All peninsula non-profits, schools, and municipalities are encouraged to apply. RSU 24- The Budget and Finance Committee is almost done with their work of reviewing the various department/school budgets of the district. There is an unavoidable rise in our budget with the majority attributed to the much-needed increase to salaries and the anticipated increase in health insurance. The full RSUB will consider and hopefully approve the budget at its April 8th meeting. The District Budget Meeting will take place on May 28th at Sumner starting @ 6:30PM. If you reside in one of our nine communities, you will be able to vote on the proposed budget at this meeting. The next step in the process is the school budget referendum held on June 10th. The referendum vote takes place in each of our communities at the designated voting station. The final budget information will be distributed to our communities after the District Budget Meeting and prior to the referendum and will be accessible on our website. We are cautiously optimistic that we will get on our baseball and softball fields this spring. We will learn a great deal as we transition into spring and see how the fields bounce back from winter. If you drive by the school, you will notice that the dugouts are nearing completion. Many thanks to the Carpentry Program from Hancock County Technical Center (located at Sumner), as they are putting the finishing touches (roof, siding, & paint) on the dugouts. For those planning ahead, the Sumner Memorial High School class night is Tuesday, June 3<sup>rd</sup> and graduation is Thursday, June 5<sup>th</sup>. Sumner Middle School will hold its 8<sup>th</sup> grade promotion on June 9th. The Adult Education Certificate Ceremony is June 4th and Adult Education Graduation is the 11th.
